# Behavior during the hike



Stay on the marked trails, avoid shortcuts



Respect crops and meadows. do not pick or collect fruit



Take your rubbish Stay discreet back in your bag respectful and courteous leave no trace to other users



Keep to the rules

specific to each site: do not make a fire. do not camp ...



keep control of your dog

keep ihm always on a leash, in some protected areas they are not allowed even on a leash. Remain crossing a herd with him.



Close fences

after opening them remain cautious of a herd and do not get close



Nature is a living environment

which evolves with time. hiking is to set off on an adventure with all the risks that go with it. Knowing how to give up and turn back is also a sign of respect

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
### **ACCESS AND DEPARTURE POINT**

Access: Bussang is on the National Road 66, follow the direction to the ski area Larcenaire.


Departure: Car park from the ski area Larcenaire

### **ROUTE AND POINTS OF INTEREST**

- In front of valley, follow the small road on your right on 100 m and join the large way marked with the green rectangle « Croix de Fresse ». Stay on this way for almost 2 km. You pass near by the « chalet de la Croix de Fresse » that offers an nice view on Bussang. A little further up is the Col de la Croix de Fresse (altitude 879 m). Continue on the right, go on the way with the red point mark. After 600 m, you can make a short detour to the Tête des Révolles to discover a nice viewpoint.
- Follow the red point marked path for 1.2 km. Pass the Peut-Haut Chalet and its memorial. Continue for 1.8 km to reach the large Rochelotte plateau and its wooden chalet.
- Pass in front of the chalet and take the path that goes down marked with a green-white-green rectangle "Larcenaire". Go down for 1 km until you arrive at a crossroads with the road to the Col du Page. Take the road on the right for 500 m, pass over the Azureva holiday village and reach your car.



# > The Croix de Fresse

Located at an altitude of 879 meters, the Croix de Fresse recalls that in these places, in 1814, 4 Grognards of Napoleon 1st died while defending this pass against the Cossacks.

### > The Tête des Révolles

Nice view on the Moselle valley, the Ballon d'Alsace and the Ballon de Servance. This place is also a paragliding take-off area.

### > The Peut Haut Memorial

This monument erected at the location of the maquis du Peut-Haut honours the memory of the resistance fighters killed "POUR QUE LA FRANCE VIVE" (FOR FRANCE TO LIVE). The maquis du Peut-Haut was created in May 1944, near the "KinsMuss" airdrop zone. In the past, it was called Camp Louis and Camp Loenig.
